


Saguni

Saguni Lodge – Okavango Delta (Khwai Concession)

A short bush flight from Maun drops you into the heart of the Okavango Delta, where Saguni Lodge rests beneath ancient ebony and leadwood trees, right along the Khwai River. Here, water and land merge, and so do the stories—of predator and prey, of stillness and sudden movement, of wilderness at its most alive.











What Makes It Special?



A Delta That Breathes Year-Round

Even when much of the Delta lies dry, waiting for the rains, the Khwai River remains a lifeline. Mokoro (canoe) safaris glide silently through channels still flowing—past hippo pools, elephants bathing at the river's edge, and jacanas dancing across lily pads.

This region stays wet when others don't, offering a rare, immersive view of the Delta's hidden rhythms.










A Sanctuary for Bird Lovers






Exceptional Game Viewing






























Raw Comfort in the Wild
